

CANAL WALK – MYTHOLMROYD TO HEBDEN BRIDGE

1. From the Dusty Miller turn right onto the main road. After 100 metres, turn right down Acre Villas, constructed in 1880. Watch out for the carved stone sign on the terrace.
2. Just before the bridge, drop down to the right and take the tow path signposted Hebden Bridge. You pass under the bridge. A little further on, there is an interpretation board on the canal tow path which explains the history of the canal and Mytholmroyd.
3. After half a mile the tow path comes to an end and you have several choices. If you cross the road to Carr Lane next to the site of Walkleys Clogs Mill (do watch out crossing there), you can pick up three different routes back to Mytholmroyd or Hebden Bridge.

For the Hebden Bridge option via the canal....

4. Carry on to beyond where the tow path finishes and cross the road where there is an island and then you can pick up the tow path on the other side of the road but again to be careful crossing the road it's very busy and people do tend to speed.
5. Just after lock H you pass Mayroyd Mill on your left which is now converted into flats.

At this point if you want to go back to the station you go off the tow path through a gap in the wall. Turn right up Mayroyd Lane and turn left on to Station approach

6. If you want to return to the centre of Hebden Bridge just carry on the towpath. The next mill on your right with green windows is Macpelah Mill which is now partly accommodation and partly businesses.
7. The towpath crosses over a bridge by the Little Theatre. Leave the towpath here by descending a slope and turn right down the street past the trades Club.
8. At the traffic lights go straight across along the pedestrianised Bridgegate to saint Georges Square.
